SSA Revenue and Expenses

Recently, our Treasurer reviewed some revenue and expenses over the last few years. What he found was that our revenue was not keeping pace with our expenses. Costs like telephone, hydro, gas and tractor repairs have increased dramatically. Dennis indicated that some of our costs have jumped more than 20 %. Please don't misunderstand! All of the executive is very much aware of this situation and try to reduce costs whenever possible!

Obviously, we can't continue to operate in a deficit position. This is another reason why we are asking you to get the newsletter on our website rather than on paper. Keep in mind that the OFAH fees increase by a small amount each year.

We have held the membership fee costs constant for the last 3 years. However, this will not be possible in 2018. You need to be prepared for an increase in 2018 to cover added club expenses! As well, we expect an even larger increase in new membership costs.

We are looking for feedback from our members soon. I expect the decision will be made at the June executive meeting.

The September newsletter will provide you with the 2018 fees and we will begin the Early Bird Membership Drive in October.

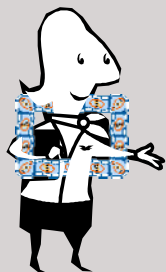

Sawmills in Eastern Canada have been running at record high levels in 2016, with production reaching levels almost 10 per cent higher than in 2015 and almost 40 per cent higher than five years ago.

Do you remember the first time you saw an animal in the wild? Maybe it was a chipmunk scurrying across a forest floor. Perhaps it was a flash of white as a pronghorn antelope bounded out of sight across the wide grassland. Or maybe, just maybe, it was the lumbering hulk of a bear nosing for berries atop a rocky cliff. Small or large, that first connection with Canada's wildlife, no doubt, stayed with you.

Today, Canada is home to 521 species at risk. These plants and animals are slowly disappearing due to loss of habitat and other threats. For a nation that defines itself through nature, this loss of wildlife hits all of us hard. Each species is important to our ecosystem; they help clean our water and produce our food. Yet each year, populations decline.

But what if it didn't have to be this way? What if you could help?

The Nature Conservancy of Canada (NCC) is dedicated to conserving Canada's natural landscapes. Through a science-based approach, NCC protects our country's sensitive ecosystems and habitats for the at-risk species that live there.

What would Canada be like without our moose, beavers or bears?
