Thanks to some dedicated members here, we're proud to announce that **Ragnarok Tactical** will be coming to SSA on June 23rd to provide their Carbine Operator's Course at an exclusive discount (40% off of the re=ular rate). We're all very excited to bring this course to SSA to further develop competitive rifle shooting, and form a base of instructed shooters that we can build on for a safe and fun discipline on our ranges.

12 students will be registered on a first-come first-serve basis, with registration presently being open to SSA members only. This course has no pre-requisites, but shooters will be expected to be proficient with the safe operation of their rifles. The purpose of the course is to develop the skills the student needs to take their shooting to the next competitive level.

Registration is limited to 12 to ensure the students get individual attention from the instructors and to conform to space limitations on our rifle range.

Please note that this course is an all-day affair. Snacks, water, etc are recommended.

The SSA grill will be fired up for the mid-day break at lunch for anyone wishing to purchase a hamburger or hot dog.

Students are expected to have basic of knowledge in their platform and strong desire to push themselves to the next level. Ragnarok Tactical offers Carbine Operator courses that are open to all modern semi-automatic platforms. We also offer courses tailored specifically for the AR15 or VZ58/C858. The Carbine Operator Course will allow students to master the fundamentals of marksmanship and firearms manipulation skills to gain a competitive edge. The Carbine Operator Course focuses on fine tuning the application of the fundamentals of marksmanship students chosen platform in all types of competitive environments. There are no prerequisites for this course.

Deposit Policy

Payment must be received within one week of registration or your slot will be forfeited to anyone waiting to register.

Refund Policy

Any cancellations within the two weeks before the course takes place are not refundable.

In extraordinary circumstances, at our discretion, we will work with you to fill your spot, make arrangements for you to attend a future course, or may provide a refund.

Holster Policy

Any duty type holster is allowed. Hard plastic/kydex holsters are encouraged. Soft nylon or leather holsters are discouraged and if they pose a safety risk will not be allowed. One size fits all holsters are not permitted, the holster needs to be for the pistol you are using. Serpa holsters are permitted.

ALL ranges will be closed on Saturday, June 2nd from 7am - 5pm as the club is once again hosting the Youth Expo The handgun range is booked on Sunday June 24th from 2pm-4pm for the live fire portion of the club level safety course.

Misuse of the Ranges

This is a reminder that we are all expected to use the ranges for their intended and approved purpose. Recently is appears someone has been shooting a shotgun in the handgun range, this is not approved for this range and is in violation of many rules. The same goes for shooting targets that are not paper, this included plastic containers, and various other items that are occasionally found on the ranges. While investigating these occurrences in many situations there have been no sign ins on the range log book, again you must sign in at every range you use each and every time you are at that range. If we want to keep the handgun range and the rimfire range open for members to use on their own, we need to ensure they are being used in the proper manner. If you find anyone violating the range rules, please try and get that individuals name, membership number, even a photo of their vehicle and forward this information on to a board member or range committee member. Any members found to be violating range rules will be dealt with accordingly.

Dogs On the Ranges

There has been more than one complaint in recent weeks of dogs running loose on live ranges.

In one case a dog ran unto the 100 yard range while shooters were actively firing. There will be a follow up in a future newsletter on this topic as the issue gets discussed at both the range committee and board of directors. It is up to the dogs owner to be in care and control of their dog at all times, no dogs are to be in or on a range while the range is in use.

If the <u>range in use</u> sign is down at the top of the hill, dogs should be leashed at all times when in the range area. If you want to walk your dog when the ranges are in use please use the area by the clubhouse.

We appreciate all dog owners assistance in addressing this issue. The alternative is no dogs allowed which is not something we want to see happen. Last but not least remember to poop and scoop.



Black Bear Barb - Wire Hair Traps

The MNRF is setting up wire hair traps on some Crown Lands and Conservation properties in the lower and upper Bruce Peninsula as part of their commitment to updating black bear population estimates across Ontario.

Survey stations will be set up in forested areas with a small amount of canned sardines to encourage bears to investigate the stations.

As the bear comes to the station, it brushes up against a single strand of barbed wire which captures a small sample of the bear's hair. MNRF staff wearing brightly – coloured safety clothing will be visiting the sites once a week for six weeks to collect any hair samples and record activity.


Signage will be posted in the area advising data collection is underway. Be aware of MNRF staff working in the area and be on the alert for black bear activity around the survey stations. Please keep all non – hunting dogs on a leash on these posted sites. Please do not disturb the survey stations and advise others about this activity.

Successful bear hunters should follow the mandatory reporting guidelines as shown in the most recent Ontario Hunting Regulations Summary.
